

Custom Dialects of Perl

Why do the immigrants speak distinctly different dialects?

- because rather than learning all of Perl,
 - each group gravitates to the parts that are most familiar
- which works because Perl is derived from Shell, C, AWK, etc.
 - and incorporates their concepts and syntax

Custom Dialects of Perl (cont.)

Educators can help the refugees apply their strategy, by:

- Teaching a subset of Perl that lets
 UNIX/Linux People capitalize on their existing knowledge
 - so they can learn Perl easily and efficiently
- Leaving out Perl's more esoteric and redundant bits
 - so they won't have to learn too much


What is Minimal Perl?

- successfully taught to Fortune 500 clients since 2000


